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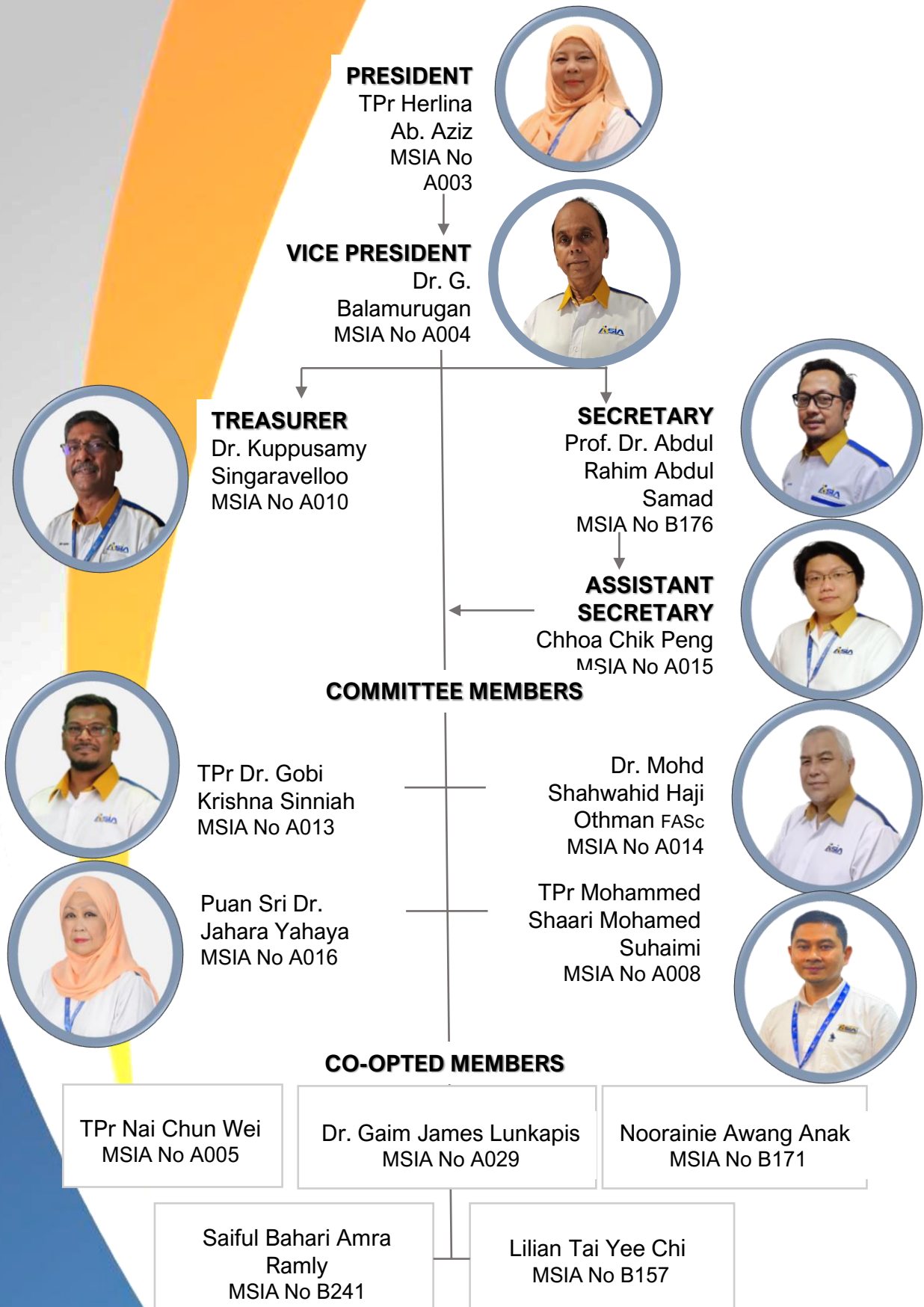

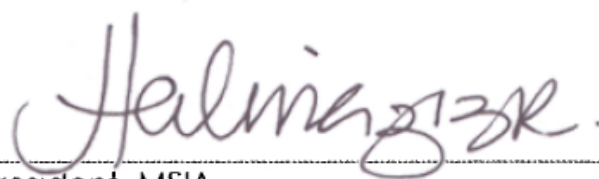

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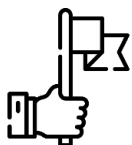

9. Shall not accept any inducement, commission, gifts or any other form of personal benefits from any interested party and shall not knowingly allow colleagues to do so.
10. Shall not intentionally communicate false and misleading statements that may compromise the integrity of any SIA study.
11. Shall act in any way that would not jeopardise the reputation of the MSIA and its members.

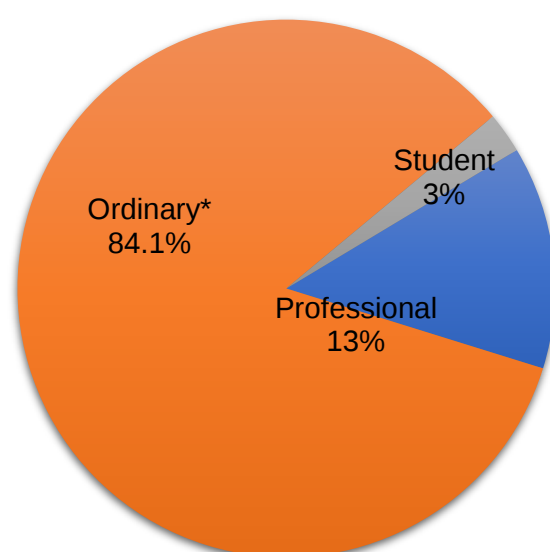

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The committee finds more applications coming from Sabah and Sarawak especially in the plantation field. Some in the field do not have submission of standalone or subsector SIA reports like those in the peninsula. In promoting the development of quality SIA reports in Sabah and Sarawak, MSIA finds the need for it to introduce another membership category, lower than Ordinary Member. The Committee has raised a proposal paper to Exco to consider introducing “**Associate Member**” category.

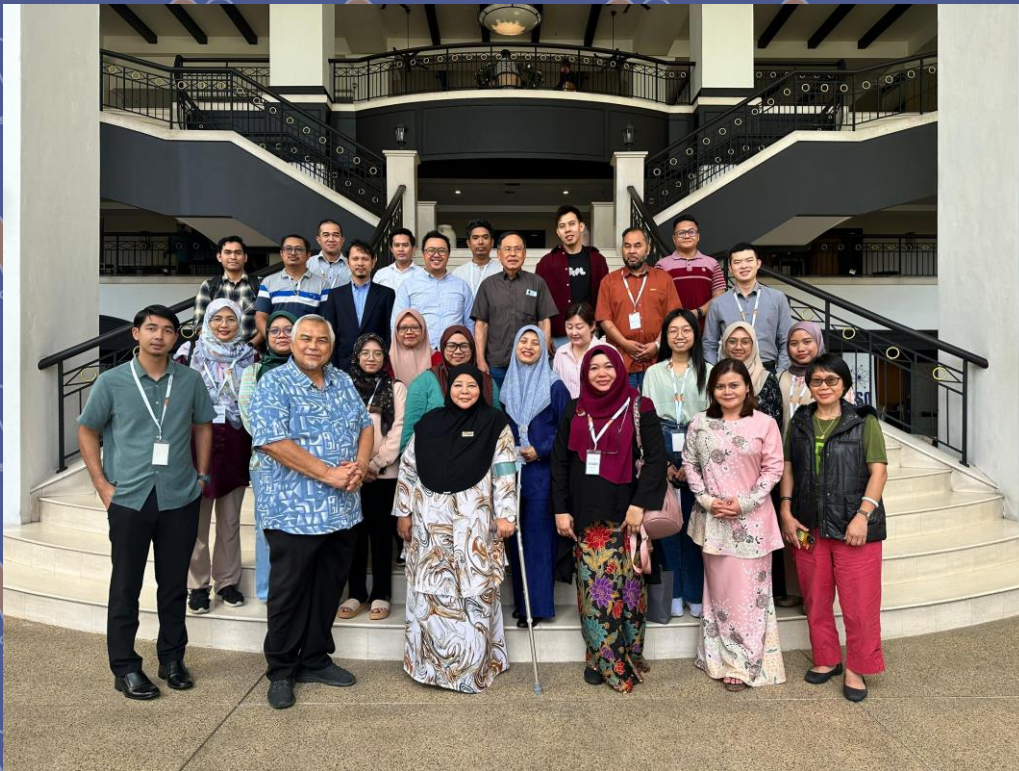

The main objectives of the research are as the followings:

- To identify and analyse baseline data and information and to develop a database to assist in informed business decision for potential development projects in Terengganu
- To integrate the baseline data and geospatial data in developing spatial model for a rapid appraisal of SIA parameters in determining development projects, and
- To provide a decision- support system (DSS) in making better informed decision through early assessment of the significance of any adverse impacts and uncertainties arising from the proposed project.

It is envisaged that a tangible deliverable of the research project is the development of a rapid SIA appraisal system **or Sistem Penilaian Impak Sosial Pantas (SIRA)** based on spatial model. SIRA will be essentially be a computerized programme which allows better decision-making with data backup for the determination and selection of development projects requiring SIA.

Pembangunan perlu penilaian impak sosial elak berlaku konflik

Banyak kita boleh belajar daripada usaha masyarakat Melayu tradisi Kampung Lama Rempang Galang di Pulau Batam, Indonesia yang cuba mempertahankan tanah leluhur daripada diusir untuk memberi laluan kepada projek memajukan kawasan itu, sekali gus membuka mata terhadap kepentingan penilaian impak sosial dalam pembangunan dan pelaburan negara.

Pulau Rempang Galang ialah sebahagian kawasan yang membentuk Koridor Pembangunan Batam dengan perancangan Projek-Projek Strategik Nasional Indonesia 2023 untuk menjadikannya sebagai pusat industri, perdagangan dan pelancongan.

Pengambilan tanah untuk menjayakan pembangunan projek ini menimbulkan konflik besar kerana membabitkan perpindahan keluar penduduk secara paksa. Kelemahan proses perundingan antara kerajaan dan pelabur dengan masyarakat mengakibatkan salah faham dan diskriminasi.

Hakikatnya, proses perundingan seumpama penting dalam penilaian impak sosial (SIA) sebelum projek diluluskan dan dilaksanakan.

SIA adalah proses mengenal pasti dan mengurus impak sosial dijangka berlaku daripada pelaksanaan projek pembangunan. Proses jelas dan tersusun akan mengenal pasti impak sosial serta golongan terkeasan, mengelak impak dengan melakukan pindaan kepada cadangan projek dan mengurusnya bagi meminimumkan impak negatif di-

jangkakan. Menurut prinsip SIA, perpindahan keluar penduduk daripada tapak projek hanya pilihan terakhir selepas semua langkah mitigasi lain diambil.

Tidak seperti Malaysia yang mewajibkan penyediaan Laporan SIA secara terancang kepada projek berkepentingan negeri dan negara sejak 2017, proses SIA mandatori di Indonesia belum dilaksanakan. Jika ia dilakukan terlebih dahulu, dengan pembabitkan pemegang taruh dan masyarakat terkeasan, sudah pasti konflik sedemikian boleh dielakkan.

Terkini di Indonesia, kajian SIA hanya dijalankan sebagai sebahagian proses penilaian alam sekitar (AMDAL) atau dalam keperluan perancangan pengambilan tanah. Namun, pada peringkat pengambilan tanah, sering terlaui lewat untuk berbuat apa-apa langkah mitigasi sosial berkesan dan bantuan penduduk sudah mencapai tahap tertinggi.

Gagal salur maklumat tepat

Dalam kes Rempang Galang ini, selain kelemahan proses rundingan, kegagalan menyalurkan maklumat mitigasi kepada penduduk juga menimbulkan keresahan memuncak. Cadangan pampasan akan diberi kepada penduduk terkeasan, iaitu gantian tanah dan rumah serta perincian lain berkaitan perpindahan tetap meningkatkan kegusaran penduduk terhadap nasib mereka di persekitaran baharu.

Walaupun Presiden Indonesia pernah berjanji semua konsesi tanah kepada pelabur bersengketa dengan rakyat akan dibatalkan, keadaan konflik di Pulau Rempang Galang belum lagi menyaksikan kesediaan pelabur, mahupun pembuat keputusan

di peringkat provinsi untuk berundur daripada meneruskan proses pengusiran.

Semua langkah pengusiran keluar perlu ditangguhkan hingga pihak terkeasan berpuas hati dengan pampasan ditawarkan dan bersedia memberi laluan kepada pembangunan di kawasan mereka.

Berbanding kesediaan garis panduan khusus penyediaan SIA di Malaysia, iaitu Panduan Pelaksanaan Penilaian Impak Sosial (PPSIA) oleh Jabatan Perancangan Bandar dan Desa, PLANMalaysia, ketiadaan garis panduan seumpama di Indonesia menguguskan kerajaan.

Pelbagai peruntukan undang-undang semasa di Indonesia memberi perhatian kepada pengurusan impak sosial secara terpilih, namun tidak menjurus khusus kepada peruntukan mandatori penyediaan SIA lebih menyeluruh bagi negara itu.

Perkara ini disedari kerajaan Indonesia yang mula menggerakkan usaha menyediakan satu Garis Panduan Teknik Penyediaan SIA Indonesia, dengan kerjasama Bank Dunia. Dengan adanya garis panduan jelas memandu pelaksanaan Kajian SIA bagi negaranya, Indonesia berharap projek berkepentingan negara dapat dilaksanakan dengan jayanya, tanpa tentangan keras penduduk.

Di sebalik kita sudah mempunyai mekanisme lebih baik, Malaysia perlu belajar daripada pengalaman pahit Rempang Galang dengan mengambil langkah memastikan pembangunan dan pelaburan di negara tidak hanya membawa kemakmuran ekonomi, bahkan keadilan sosial kepada rakyat.

Pelabur dan pemaui ke Malaysia juga perlu memahami proses SIA dengan teliti serta menyeluruh adalah penting untuk menjamin kelancaran projek, kedamaian negara dan kebahagiaan rakyat.

Income and Expenditure Account

Based on the Income and Expenditure Account statement, total revenue received by MSIA was RM 109,227.09 in 2023 as against RM 97,615.00 in 2022. The main revenue sources are from (i) Professional Training workshops, and (i) Membership subscription.

The share of revenue from professional training workshops increased in 2023 to RM 71,770.00 compared with RM 65,750.00 in 2022. In 2023, four training workshops contributed to this increase.

The year 2023 also witnessed the debut of revenue from sale of MSIA book published and launched at the AGM.

Key expenditure categories are (i) cost of conducting professional training workshops, (ii) publication costs, (iii) general administration, (iv) meeting expenses (AGM), and (v) cost of participation in IAIA conference at Kuching.

Following the four training workshops conducted in 2023, the total expenditure also rose to RM 53,916.12 as against only RM 41,299.25 in 2022.

The MSIA book published in May 2023 and the publication of MSIA reading series brought about an expenditure of RM 26,284.96 as compared to only RM 2,200.00 in 2022.

Another debut in MSIA's account is an expenditure due to the participation of the President at the IAIA Conference at Kuching in 2023. This carried a total expense of RM 6,688.45.

On administration, the key difference is due to honorarium payment to the secretariat staff which was for work done in 2022. As at 31st December 2023, total expenditure in 2023 increased to RM 109,223.33 as against RM 64,302.86 in 2022. As a result, total excess of revenue over expenditure has dropped from RM 33,312.14 in 2022 to only RM 3.76 in 2023. As mentioned earlier, the year 2023 saw a breakeven account in 2023, mainly due to an increase in expenses for training workshops, the introduction of MSIA's publications, and the participation at IAIA. Perhaps 2024 will see more revenue coming from the sale of the remaining copies of the book as only RM9,052.00 was retrieved in 2023 in a span of about six months.

Following the number of activities of MSIA throughout 2023, total balance in the current account increased to RM 177,818.99 by 31st December 2023.
